EASTER DEVOTION

"So they went out and fled from the tomb and said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid."

What? What kind of ending is that?

It is, in fact, the ending of Mark's gospel, the way in which this author wraps up the resurrection of Jesus. Not with a promise from Jesus to be with us to the end of the age; that's Matthew's version. Not by ascending into heaven while the disciples peer up into the sky; that's Luke's version. And not with a breakfast of bread and fish on the beach; that's in John's gospel. In Mark, everything just...ends. Suddenly. Awkwardly. With the rest of the story left unwritten.

Because there must have been more. After all, the evidence indicates Mark's gospel is the first to have been written down, which means somebody must have said something about the resurrection or it would have remained a secret. Things didn't really end in fear and silence, or there would be no gospels at all, right? The women must have told somebody. You and I wouldn't be in Easter worship if they hadn't.

And yet life is full of the kind of awkward, unpolished, confusing endings that Mark describes. Things can end so suddenly, without warning, in ways both big and small. We can leave things just like the women did: fleeing in fear, without understanding what on earth is going on. Perhaps our marriages end, or our good health ends, or our friendships end, or our dreams end; our jobs, our plans, our hope for the future can come to a crashing halt. We are unmoored, unprepared, and afraid.

Mark's gospel stops in the middle of it all, somewhere between the ending and a new beginning. This is good news for those of us who spend a lot of our lives in the messy middle. Have you ever felt afraid to let go of the past? Then resurrection is for you. Have you ever been unsure about the future? Then Easter is for you. Have you ever been reluctant to say anything to anyone because you weren't even sure how to start? Then you're in good company, with the women at the empty tomb.

Easter joy arrives in the middle of it all. Right where you're at, in endings and beginnings. May the joy of Jesus' risen life, in all its beautiful, mysterious, persistent hope, find you today, and give you hope. For Christ is risen! Christ is risen indeed!
