Building and Grounds – State of the Building

- Building expansion was undertaken in 2004
- Building today is 28,500 square feet
- •8 bathrooms with 13 toilets & urinals
- •13 furnaces located in 4 different locations, newest is 20 years old
- kitchen equipment is all 20 years old
- 350 light bulbs and fluorescent tubes

Property Committee

- Work parties, 10-12 times a year, to tackle larger jobs.
- Every week an individual or small group of Property Committee members are undertaking tasks
- Estimated volunteer hours over 800 combined hours annually
- Committee members regularly consult with Parish Administrator concerning contract services
 - Sprinkler System & Alarm
 - HVAC Equipment
 - Kitchen Fire Suppression System
 - Elevator Inspection & Servicing
 - Because of the age of our equipment, we are having to not only perform maintenance, but also upgrade to meet new codes

- Plumbing- Toilets, Leaking Faucets
- Exterior and Interior Painting
- Ramp Construction
- Preschool area four-foot fences & gates
- Columbarium patio bench installation
- Pressure Washing

- Adding lighting in the Sanctuary and to the Exterior of the Building
- Fence installation on the south property line
- Upgrading the smaller podium in Sanctuary
- Formica Wall Covering in the Kitchen
- Acoustic enclosures around the air filtration units
- Tree Maintenance
- Exterior Signage-repairs and painting


Today: There are 36.4 Mill. Refugees world-wide. 41% of them are children.


- Read books, study websites, talk with other refugee resettlement groups

Adopted Budget Recap

- Total budget is essentially the same as last year.
- Income is almost entirely giving your gift matters!
- A Balanced Budget Assumes a giving increase of 7%
- A Balanced Budget Assumes using 31% of General Fund balance to fund any shortfall.



Budget Status through Dec 2023

- Income <u>above</u> expenses by 3%
- Expenses <u>below</u> budget by 8%
- Giving <u>below</u> budget by 5%

Good News:

- Giving up 12% vs. last year, helped by historically strong December
- Number of donors up 6% (25 households) vs. last year

Outlook for Remainder of Fiscal Year 23-24

- Thank you for your gifts!
- Historically strong December puts us in strong position entering second half of fiscal year
- Budget development starts in February predictable, sustained giving helps instill confidence in the budget



Strategic Planning Update

2019 - We began a new Strategic Planning Initiative in 2019, collecting a large amount of information on what the congregation and staff felt were our strengths, challenges and hopes for the future.

2020 – COVID lockdowns put all activities on the shelf!

2023 – A new Strategic Planning Committee has restarted the process. They are looking at what has changed, beginning to flesh this out how our strengths and challenges have changed.
